<b>Program, Program Intent and Anticipated Allocation</b>
<p><b><u>Title I, Part A anticipated allocation: \$444,568</u></b> <b><u>Program Intent:</u></b> Funding for resources to help schools with high concentrations of students from low-income families provide a high-quality education enabling all children to meet the state's student performance standards. <b><u>Proposed Uses:</u></b> This money funds six instructional coaches and reading intervention teachers.</p>
<p><b><u>Title II, Part A anticipated allocation: \$112,887</u></b> <b><u>Program Intent:</u></b> Teacher and Principal Training and Recruiting Funds (TPTR) are designated to supplement staff development in district/campus priority areas, enhance recruiting, hiring, and retention of highly qualified teachers and improve the quality of our principal, teacher, and paraprofessional work force through staff development. <b><u>Proposed Uses:</u></b> Funds professional development to build capacity of administrators and teacher leaders.</p>
<p><b><u>Title III, Part A anticipated allocation: \$22,954</u></b> <b><u>Program Intent:</u></b> English Language Acquisition, Language Enhancement, and Academic Achievement Act Funds ensure that English Learner students develop English proficiency and meet the same academic achievement standards other students achieve. <b><u>Proposed Uses:</u></b> Funds professional development to build capacity of ESL teacher leaders and administrators.</p>
<p><b><u>Title IV, Part A anticipated allocation: \$33,139</u></b> <b><u>Program Intent:</u></b> Student Support and Academic Enrichment Grant Funds are designed to improve students' academic achievement by increasing the capacity of the district to provide access to, and opportunities for, a well-rounded education for all students; improve school conditions in order to create a healthy and safe school environment; and improve access to technology in the classroom. <b><u>Proposed Uses:</u></b> Funds social emotional learning, college prep assessments, and technology to implement curriculum.</p>
<p><b><u>Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER I) anticipated allocation \$411,181</u></b> <b><u>Program Intent:</u></b> This emergency funding that will expire in September 2022 will allow the district to pay for the direct costs incurred for planning and mitigation of the coronavirus pandemic such as additional technology, hot spots for internet service, costs of distance learning, and cleaning of buildings to include staff time and supplies, planning and implementing activities related to summer learning and supplemental afterschool programs, including providing classroom instruction</p>

or online learning during the summer months and addressing the needs of low-income students, students with disabilities, English learners, migrant students, students experiencing homelessness, and children in foster care. Pre-award allowable costs dating back to March 13, 2020 are eligible.

**Proposed Uses:** Teacher pre-award salaries, PPE, Science materials, PNP materials, Teacher webcams and headsets.

**Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA)**

**Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER II) anticipated allocation:**

**\$1,524,120 (amount finalized after hold harmless deducted in September)**

**Program Intent:** This emergency funding that will expire in September 2023 is intended to help school districts safely reopen schools, measure and effectively address significant learning loss, and take other actions to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 on the students and families who depend on our K-12 schools. Pre-award allowable costs dating back to March 13, 2020 are eligible.

**Proposed Uses:** To be determined - Communities in Schools, Counselor at ALC

**American Rescue Plan (ARP)**

**Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER III) anticipated allocation:** \$2,281,971: with set asides removed, amount available is \$1,707,577

**Program Intent:** This emergency funding that will expire in September 2024 is to help safely reopen and sustain the safe operation of schools and address the impact of the coronavirus pandemic on students; 20% of the funds must be used to address student learning loss.

**Proposed Uses:** Instructional coaches, intervention teachers, co-teachers, paraprofessional support, tutorial programs
